Thomas Blaser



Longtime North Rosedale Park resident Thomas Blaser passed peacefully at his home at the age of 90 in February. Tom and his mother moved into their Georgian Colonial home on Shaftsbury in 1960. He was a design specialist at the J.L.

Hudson Company's Interior Design Studios, with a career spanning five decades.

He was a generous supporter of NRPCA and the Legacy Project, being among the core group that kicked off the Project at a fundraising event in 2012. With its beautiful antiques and furnishings collected over a lifetime, his home was a popular feature on several North Rosedale Park Home & Garden tours, most recently in 2013. Tom also lent his expertise to the Legacy Project's Architectural Review Committee as it developed recommendations on upgrades to the Community House.

As COVID locked us in our homes, neighbors gathered in front of Tom's home on "Waving Wednesdays" – our chance to check on each other and say we were okay, a ritual that evolved into "Wednesdays at Tom's." Many have benefitted from his kindness and generosity, and he will be greatly missed.

Tracie Golden

The life of Tracie Golden, a native of Detroit and North Rosedale Park resident, was tragically cut short during a carjacking in the parking lot of an area business in December. The news was devastating to her family and area residents.

Tracie, 53, pursued her passion for healthcare by earning a degree in respiratory therapy at Oakland Community College. She was known for her compassion and commitment to helping others at Sinai-Grace Hospital, where she worked in the emergency room, critical care units and



the pulmonary function laboratory.

Aside from her work, Tracie loved to cook and entertain, carrying on a tradition started by her grandfather. She even ventured into several foodbased businesses.

Tracie is survived by her husband, John Golden; a daughter, Bianca; her nephew, Justin; and godson Lyndon.
