
## NRPCA Creates New Family Programming Committee

# Civic Association Memberships Increase in 2023

### Help Us Reach Our Goal of 500 Memberships

As of May 1, we have a total of 410 residents who have paid NRPCA membership dues for 2023. That count includes Red Rose members who pay above the \$75 rate to provide extra support for the community, as well as Life Members who pay dues although they are not required to do so. To put our current numbers in perspective, by the end of 2022, we had 290 paid memberships. That participation rate was likely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and all the challenges that many of us faced.

Our current membership numbers are on pace to reach our goal of 500 for this year! As many of you know, our dues support programming and help maintain the North Rosedale Park Community House and Grounds, the hub of our neighborhood. With your help we can easily reach and surpass our goal for 2023. After all, there are 1600 homes in our beautiful community.
